Campaign for the 21st Century Well Underway

(November 19, 2007) - United Hebrew Geriatric Center (UHGC) recently held its 88th Annual Gala at Fenway Golf Club in Scarsdale, NY. UHGC long time leaders and supporters Patricia and Malcolm Lazarus and UHGC president and CEO Rita Mabli were honored for their years of service and dedication to the growth and success of UHGC. Actor and comedian Robert Klein entertained nearly 250 guests. The Peter Lawrence Orchestra provided music for the evening.

Francine and Glenn Aber and Phyllis and Don Duberstein, all of Purchase; and Caryl and Steven Lazarus of New Rochelle served as event co-chairpersons.

The event raised \$300,000, which will support the UGC Foundation's *Campaign for the 21st Century*. The UGC Foundation was established in 1997 to raise funds for UHGC programs and services.

The goal of the *Campaign for the 21st Century* is to raise funds for its \$56 million project to build the Lucile and Joseph Skalet Pavilion and upgrade the Lola and Saul Kramer Pavilion. It is UHGC's first major campaign since the construction of the Kramer

Pavilion almost 30 years ago. The new nursing facility is scheduled for completion in fall 2008.

To date, the campaign has raised nearly \$5 million in pledges and gifts toward the \$6.8 million goal. UHGC also received a \$1.5 million challenge grant awarded by the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation.

"Pat and Mal Lazarus have given tirelessly to all of our projects and are extremely generous with their support. They are truly an amazing team, and I can think of no more deserving people for tonight's honor," said Michael Rozen, Executive Chair of the UHGC Board of Directors.

I look forward to working with her and continue on our path to the future," Rozen added.
